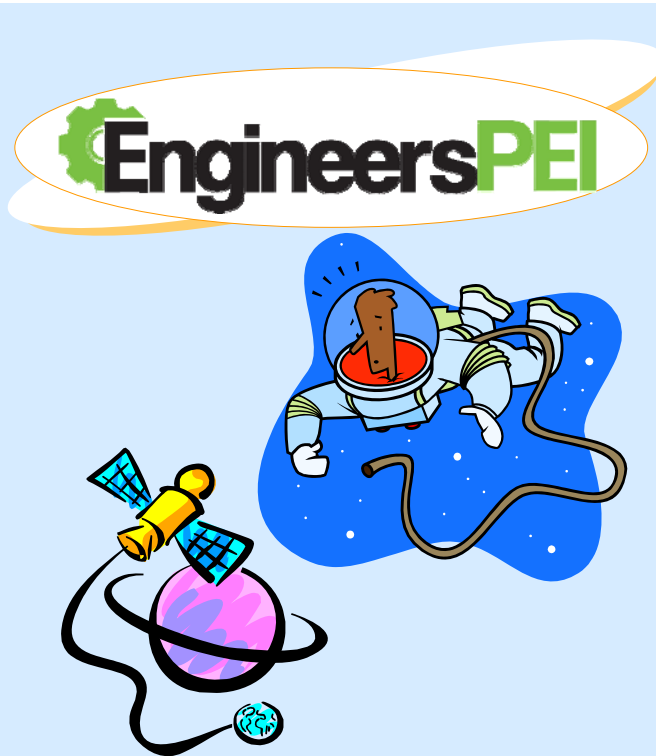

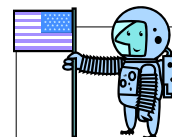

THE SKY IS NO LIMIT LIVING AND EXPLORING SPACE



On July 1969, Astronaut George Armstrong set foot on the moon.

On March 1972, Pioneer 10 was launched to be the first space probe to an outer planet, the first spacecraft to travel through the asteroid belt, the first spacecraft to make direct observations and obtain close-up images of Jupiter, and the first man-made object to leave the solar system.



On February 1975, Viking I was the first orbiter and lander sent and successful landed on Mars.



In 2100, will we be living and working on the other planets?

- If so, what will our new city look like? Our houses? Our schools? Our Mall? Our Buildings?
- How do we travel from one part of the city to another? Will we have roads and highways? What kind of transportation will be using? How do we get to the planet and back to Earth?
